If you take medication, you may want to store it in a drug wallet or pill box to help remind you to take it as prescribed. Some drug wallets have compartments with days of the week on them. The compartments can be removed so you can take a dose with you if you are going out. Some products also have timers or alarms to help remind you.

This factsheet lists some suppliers of drug wallets and similar products. For further details contact each company directly. Some products may be available from pharmacies, GPs or community health teams.

**Some anti-epileptic drug tablets are not suitable for splitting or crushing. Dispersible tablets (that dissolve in water) can't be stored in drug wallets because they react to the air.** You can check the label or patient information leaflet that comes with your medication, or ask your doctor or pharmacist if you are unsure about storing your medication in a drug wallet. If you find it difficult to take your medication, you can talk to your doctor about whether your medication comes in a different format or packaging that is easier for you to use.
